

School Uniform

School uniform helps to promote a sense of belonging to our school community. It also ensures that pupils are wearing sensible clothes for their learning activities. We need the support of parents and carers to ensure that our school uniform policy is followed.

Uniform can be bought from any shop or supplier providing it uses the colours below. Items with the school logo can be bought from our supplier: Penn UK. Phone 01268 751724, www.pennuk.com. They are happy to offer a delivery service to school if you are unable to visit the shop.

Main school uniform

Our pupils wear:

- white polo shirts (with or without school shield)
- grey trousers or skirts.
- bottle-green jumpers or cardigans (with or without school shield)
- green and white dresses may be worn in the summer

Footwear

The purpose of footwear is to provide a solid, sturdy grip for learning activities and playtimes. Footwear is to be black but can be shoes or trainers. If worn, trainers must be completely black.

PE Kit

Our PE kit is black shorts and white t-shirt (with or without school shield).

Jewellery

The wearing of jewellery items is not allowed due to the potential safety risk to our pupils. The only exception to our no jewellery rule is earrings. Pupils are allowed to wear one pair of plain ear studs in school but these must be removed for PE activities. If the child cannot remove the earrings then parents should ensure earrings are not worn on PE days. We request that Foundation pupils do not wear earrings on PE days. Pupils should not wear nail varnish or tattoos.

School Lunches and Breakfast Club

At lunchtime, pupils can have either a healthy meal from our school kitchen or they can bring their own healthy packed lunch. Pupils are not allowed to bring sweets or chocolate into school (this includes chocolate spread). On Fridays, packed lunches may contain a small chocolate treat.

From September 2014 pupils in Foundation and KS1 are entitled to free school dinners. Pupils in KS2 should send dinner money into school in a named envelope. Dinners need to be paid for in advance, either on the day or weekly.

Breakfast club

A school breakfast club runs from 7:45 am every morning. There is no need to book. If you would like to come to the club then just turn up. This breakfast club fee covers supervision and a breakfast of cereal, toast, beans on toast, tea or hot chocolate.

Fruit and snacks & snack bar

Pupils in YF, Y1 and Y2 are given a piece of fruit as part of the Healthy Schools Initiative. KS2 pupils can buy fresh fruit and drinks at breaktime. Milk is available, at a charge, for Foundation and KS1 pupils
